

"Your fasts should not be with the hypocrites, for they fast on Mondays and Thursdays. You should fast on Wednesdays and Fridays.

And do not pray like the hypocrites, but rather as the Lord commanded in the gospel: Our Father in heaven, holy be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us enough bread day-by-day. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one.

Pray this three times each day."

"If you are in your own home, pray at the third hour [9 am] and praise God. If you are elsewhere at that moment, pray in your own heart. Because at this hour, Christ was seen nailed upon the tree."


"Pray as well on the sixth hour [noon]. Because when Christ was nailed to the wood of the cross, daylight was suspended and a great darkness came upon the land."

"Let there also be full prayer and praise at the ninth hour [3 pm] ... At that hour Christ was pierced in his side and shed forth both water and blood."


"At about midnight rise and wash your hands with water and pray. And if you have a wife, both of you pray together. Be not slothful to pray ... At this hour all creation pauses for a brief moment to praise the Lord."

"At cockcrow, our eyes looking towards that day in the hope of eternal light at the resurrection of the dead."


- "Assemble yourselves every day, morning and evening, singing psalms and praying in the Lord's house, in the morning singing the 62nd psalm, and in the evening the 140th."

 ~380 AD




- Desert Fathers:





and kneel before the Lord our Maker.


For he is our God,
